Trailer Trash

If you have a boat trailer (with or without a boat) stored on club property you know this is one of the very best benefits of club membership. As with most things in life, there is a price to pay. Good news is the financial cost is very small, only about ten bucks a month. Club policy says that each member is responsible for the upkeep of their assigned slip, dock space (for board boats) and/or trailer space. That means mowing the grass under your trailer is YOUR job. Same goes for draining the rainwater from YOUR hull and other common-sense chores.

With increased membership we are storing more boats and trailers than ever before. Springtime means rain and rapid growth of weeds and grass.
