Commodore's Corner

When and if you decide to visit the club, please keep in mind social distancing, wearing a mask and club mandated rules enacted by the board for your safety and the safety of all our members and families. Please think responsibly!

The committee boat looks great! Pat and folks have done a wonderful job on "the Crow". Please feel free to check it out. There's the new anchor management system, handpainted crows by Gaye Hubble, a brand-new gel-coated console and many other updates. Howard Webb is on vacation until late October. He was working on wiring the console, but he ran out of time. We need someone with experience and "knows what they're doing" to hook it up. Please contact the Vice or myself.



As usual, we need help keeping up with our nearly 3.5 acres of club grounds. That includes weed whacking, weed pulling, cleaning of plant beds, mowing, sticker control, painting (touch ups where needed), trash, recycling, club house cleanup and weed killing in the driveway. Please contact Ted Hubble or myself for more information. We have a lot of outdoor space to social distance that could use some TLC. Thank you.

The docks and new finger docks! A reminder we are nearing the T-head on the eastern dock. If you feel the need to attach bumpers to the dock, please keep in mind you are not allowed to attach directly to the Trex. You may use a handful of ways to attach to the frame. We are hoping these

will last us for many years! Your help and thoughtfulness will help maintain these. Make sure you boats are tied to the PVC in the back and D-Rings in the front only! Please replace docks lines as needed. Thank you.

Clubhouse cleaning. We still need to clean the inside of the clubhouse weekly, we have cleaning supplies, spray bottles of disinfectant, paper towels and boxes of gloves for cleaning use. Please use these for the club only and clean everything you touch! Disinfect handles, knobs and light switches. A Reminder, you are REQUIRED to wear a mask indoors at all times. Sorry for the inconvenience.

Racing and Social events at the club. In talking with the Catalina 22 fleet governor, it looks like we will be postponing the Catalina 22, 2020 regionals at Lake Worth (to return, next year). We have also cancelled nearly all our races. The Sunfish regatta is still up in the air (I expect it will be cancelled soon). We have left Wednesday night sailing open; you can come out, take your boat and sail around the bridge and back with us. (The club will not be providing food or any services during this time). We ask that you refrain from using the club house as much as possible. We are working on creating some social distancing activities. During this time, we ask that there are NO potlucks, groups cookouts etc. Thank you for your patience.

The Fireplace. The newly repaired fireplace has been completed and lightly tested. We will perform further testing and firing of the bricks in the upcoming weeks. The new grate should be arriving in the not too distant future and the anchor-shaped andirons are being repaired.

Pulling Boats. As Ted mentioned during the Board meeting, we will be pulling boats out on Saturday morning. We could use some assistance and also trucks to pull. Here's the inventory getting pulled. Covid-19 club rules still in effect

- 1. FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED TO ENTER ANY INDOOR FACILITIES OR INTERFACE WITH THE BOARD MEMBERS. All persons over the age of ten (10), including visitors, invitees and contractors ("Patrons"), who enter the business must wear a face covering over their nose and mouth, such as a homemade mask, scarf, bandana, or handkerchief. No matter the location. This is for the member's safety. The requirement of a face covering does not apply if covering the nose and mouth poses a significant mental or physical health risk to the individual.
- The requirement of a face covering also does not apply when an individual is consuming a food or beverage or receiving a service where the wearing of a mask would impair the performance of the service
- 2. SOCIAL DISTANCING PROTOCOLS. Even with the use of appropriate face coverings, individuals should maintain six feet of social distancing whenever possible. Members should not work within six (6) feet of one another, except to the extent necessary to provide services. Patrons should maintain six (6) feet of separation from other individuals outside their household, to the extent feasible while wearing masks indoors. Patrons on the grounds but outdoors must also maintain six (6) feet of separation from other individuals outside their household.
- 3. GUESTS. We are asking that Members only bring a maximum of one (1) guest to the club. We do not need a bunch of strangers running around. We have a small private club; we need to help by not spreading the virus. We also remind our Members that they are responsible for their guest and their guests' actions.

Frequently asked questions

Will I be required to wear a face covering while visiting the clubhouse, office, etc.?

• Yes, all people will be required to wear a face covering once they are indoors. If a Member or Guest leaves the table to visit the restroom or other similar activity a face covering is required.

Will Members be required to wear a face covering while on the Docks, Grounds or Sailing?

• No. However, we highly recommend using a facial covering while on the Docks and Grounds.

Can Members be asked to leave if they do not comply with the Executive Order?

• We certainly hope this will not happen, but yes. The exception will be if covering the nose and mouth poses a significant mental or physical health risk to the individual. Members can be asked to leave by any board member that are not in compliance. Probations will be voted on and handed out by the board if needed.

- No races scheduled at this time. Discussed a single hand race to accommodate COVID restrictions.
