

SAFETY FIRST

With the winter weather and cold conditions looming, it is a good idea to keep the inside of the boat and crew prepared as much as possible. It is always a good idea to keep a man overboard bag on the boat. In the winter months, the bag should include thick, oversize clothing, blankets, hand/feet warmers. Have a throwable with a line attached easily available to toss at a moment's notice. A ladder (rigid or makeshift) is also a good idea to help get a fallen sailor out when weather, strength, and urgency are at play. Lastly, a working, easy to access cell phone to call for help to be waiting upon getting back to shore.

Even though you may be the most prepared sailor/team/boat in the history of sailing, things happen. Be smart on the water, especially during inclement weather. The water and wind are colder than we think, and the boats are slower than they feel when in a hurry.

We have all heard one version or the other of the Lake Worth Goat Man story/legend. Most start with "It was a dark and stormy night". (sailors' stories do too!)


Is there really a half man half goat hurling tires around Greer Island or has he retired from his wild ways to spend peaceful moonlit nights on Goat Island?
